FEAST OF OUR LADY OF LOURDES

In the build-up to the Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes this Friday, the Holy Rosary will be prayed for the sick of the world every day at the Cathedral. St John Paul II instituted the Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes as the World Day of the Sick. As such, and in keeping with the spirit of the feast, the Sacrament of the Sick will be available after Mass for those who wish to be anointed.

MASS INTENTIONS

The origin of Masses being offered for particular intentions, especially for the dead, has a long history in the Church, even to her very beginnings. On the tomb of Abercius, the second century Bishop of Phrygia, the inscription asks for prayers for the repose of his soul. St Monica asked her son, St Augustine, to remember her 'at the altar of the Lord, wherever you may be.'

We have Masses offered for particular intentions, for the living and the dead, in good times and bad.

If you would like a Mass offered for a particular intention, envelopes can be found at the entrance to the Cathedral.

ALERT LEVEL: ZERO
