The Sacrament of Reconciliation - The Sacrament of Reconciliation is available in **the Mostyn Room** at scheduled times throughout the week. Access into the Mostyn Room is via the courtyard. Offeren yn Gymraeg – Mass will be celebrated in Welsh via live-streaming on **Friday, 18th September**, beginning at **6:00pm**. I would like to thank the Cathedral community for their encouragement and support as I practice celebrating Mass in Welsh.

The Angelus - The Angelus is prayed each Saturday morning, at 9:00am on Facebook Live, broadcast from the shrine chapel of Our Lady of Penrhys; a prayerful way to begin the weekend. All parishioners and visitors to the Cathedral are remembered in prayer.

October is traditionally dedicated as the month of the Holy Rosary, principally due to the fact that the feast day of Our Lady of the Rosary is celebrated on the 7th October. I would like to pray the rosary daily throughout the month of October. More information coming soon.
