Prayer and Worship

Instructions for Attending the Celebration of Mass - As you can see, things are in no way back to normal, yet. The **stewards** are available at the back of the Cathedral to help and guide you. I am very grateful to the stewards for their dedication and commitment. The **Track and Trace** system which is in place is there to safeguard visitors to the Cathedral for the celebration of Mass. **Masks** must be worn inside the Cathedral both for private prayer and also for Mass. I will explain how Holy Communion will work during the celebration of Mass. Instructions for attending Mass are available on the Cathedral website. Bring a Jumper – Even at the best of times, the Cathedral is not known for its tropical climate! As the weather gets steadily colder, I would recommend bringing an extra layer with you when coming to Mass. We need to keep the Cathedral doors open to maintain air flow.

Cathedral Stewards – I am looking to open the Cathedral Saturday mornings for public Mass at 10:00am as well as for private prayer afterwards, while the Sacrament of Confession is available in the Mostyn Room. I have had one volunteer who can assist depending on shift patterns. If you are available to assist **Saturday mornings between 9:40am – 12:00pm**, please speak with me after Mass.

The Sacrament of Reconciliation - The Sacrament of Reconciliation is available in **the Mostyn Room** at scheduled times throughout the week. Access into the Mostyn Room is via the courtyard. Like with the celebration of Mass, masks must be worn inside the Mostyn Room. Please consult the schedule for up-to-date times of Confessions.

World Apostolate of Fatima: Novena – Even though the novena hasn't yet finished, it has already been a source of great grace for our Cathedral and diocesan family. The novena continues each evening until Tuesday, 13th October. The novena begins at 7:30pm for an hour each evening, via Zoom and Facebook. Each evening, the Novena prayer and the Litany of the Our Lady of Fatima will be prayed. **Zoom ID – 588 891 8462.**

October continues to be prayed daily via Zoom, **beginning at 12:00pm**. The login details for the Cathedral's Zoom is located at the top of page 2 of this newsletter.

Offeren yn Gymraeg - Mass will be celebrated in Welsh via live-streaming only this Friday evening, beginning at **6:00pm**.

The Forty Martyrs - This year, we celebrate the fortieth anniversary of the canonisation of the Forty Martyrs of England and Wales by Pope St. Paul VI on **Sunday, 25th October 2020**. Pope Paul VI reflects: *“Our time needs saints, and especially the example of those who have given the supreme witness for the love of Christ and His Church: “no one has a greater love than the one who gives his life for his friends” These words of the Divine Master [...] also apply to the great and chosen host of martyrs of all times, from the first persecutions of the Church rising up to those – perhaps more hidden but no less cruel – of our day”.*

Month dedicated to the Holy Souls - November is the month we traditionally remember those who have died and gone before us. It is a work of mercy to pray for our dead. The November lists are now available for you to take and complete for those you want to remember. You can pick up the list at the back of the Cathedral, or download a blank form from the Cathedral website. Return the list to the Cathedral by placing it in an envelope with a donation for the Holy Souls if you wish. This year, the Book of Remembrance will be displayed in the display cabinet, and will not be available to touch and go through, as normal. I am creating a *Virtual Book of Remembrance* by scanning in the returned forms. I have started the *Virtual Book of Remembrance* on the website.

During the month of November, the *de profundis* will be prayed for the faithful departed, whose names are placed in the Book of Remembrance.
