## Resuming of Public Masses

It is with great thanksgiving that we are once again able to reopen the Cathedral doors for public worship after the two-week 'firebreak lockdown'. While the closing of our doors meant a suspension of the public celebration of the Sacred Liturgy, it did not mean an end to the mission of the Cathedral of the proclamation of the Gospel. I have received correspondence from many reflecting how their time of lockdown has been spiritually fruitful; a time of retreat, spent listening attentively to the voice of the Lord, who continually calls us into a deeper and deeper relationship with Him. This is a profound reminder to us that our faith is not something of an optional extra which can be put on hold for two weeks; it is something which is

profoundly part of who we are. By gathering together as a community of faith we make a public declaration of our faith. Being able to gather together again means that the fruits which we have received during the time of lockdown are now able to be nurtured, cultivated, and given the opportunity to blossom. Through being able to gather again for the Sacred Liturgy, we are able to reflect the sentiments of the psalmist today, and: "*gaze on [the Lord] in the sanctuary*".

The second reading today profoundly reminds us that, as Christians, we are people of hope; and it is only by holding on to this hope are we able to move beyond the trials and frustrations of this time. Let us not allow the fear of the secular world to eclipse our hope with despair. Please pray for our brothers and sisters in England, who this last week entered into a monthlong lockdown, particularly those from our own diocese, in the deanery of Herefordshire.

## Prayer and Worship

**Instructions for Attending the Celebration of Mass** – It is wonderful to be able to welcome you all back to the Cathedral. The **stewards** are available at the back of the Cathedral to help and guide you. I am very grateful to the stewards for their dedication and commitment. The **Track and Trace** system which is in place is there to safeguard visitors to the Cathedral for the celebration of Mass. **Masks** must be worn inside the Cathedral at all times, both for private prayer and also for Mass. **Month dedicated to the Holy Souls** - November is the month we traditionally

remember those who have died and gone before us. It is a work of mercy to pray for our dead. The November lists are now available for you to take and complete for those you want to remember. There are still blank forms available, as well as being able to download from the Cathedral website. Return the list to the Cathedral by placing it in an envelope with a donation for the Holy Souls if you wish. This year, the Book of Remembrance will not be available to touch or go through, as normal. I have also created a *Virtual Book of Remembrance* by scanning in the returned forms. The forms which have been returned have been scanned and uploaded, and are available on the website. During the month of November, the *de profundis* will be prayed for the faithful departed, whose names are placed in the Book of Remembrance.

**Mass for Deceased Clergy** – It is traditional during the month of November to pray for the repose of the souls of the clergy who have gone before us, marked with the sign of faith, particularly remembering those who have died in the past year. Archbishop George will celebrate the Mass for Deceased Clergy via live-streaming only on **Thursday, 26<sup>th</sup> November**, at the **6:00pm Mass**. Solemn Vespers for the dead will be prayed at 5:00pm.

**Offeren yn Gymraeg** – The next celebration of Mass in Welsh via live-streaming will take place on **Friday, 20<sup>th</sup> November 2020**, beginning at **6:00pm**.
