Words from Our Holy Father from his Wednesday Catechesis (11/11)

The teaching of the Gospel is clear: we need to pray always, even when everything seems in vain, when God appears to be deaf and mute and it seems we are wasting time. Even if heaven is overshadowed, the Christian does not stop praying. A Christian's prayer keeps stride with his or her faith. There are many days of our life when faith seems to be an illusion, a sterile exertion. There are moments of darkness in our life, and in those moments, faith may seem to be an illusion. But the practice of prayer means accepting even this exertion. But we must continue exerting ourselves in the tough moments, the moments in which we feel nothing.

Prayer and Worship

Instructions for Attending the Celebration of Mass – It is wonderful to be able to welcome you all back to the Cathedral. The **stewards** are available at the back of the Cathedral to help and guide you. I am very grateful to the stewards for their dedication and commitment. The **Track and Trace** system which is in place is there to safeguard visitors to the Cathedral for the celebration of Mass. **Masks** must be worn inside the Cathedral at all times, both for private prayer and also for Mass. If you have an exemption from the doctor, please show your information card to the stewards. Instructions for attending Mass are available on the Cathedral website. The Sacrament of Reconciliation - The Sacrament of Reconciliation is available in **the Mostyn Room** at scheduled times throughout the week. Access into the Mostyn Room is via the courtyard. Like with the celebration of Mass, masks must be worn inside the Mostyn Room. Please consult the schedule for up-to-date times of Confessions.

Month dedicated to the Holy Souls - November is the month we traditionally remember those who have died and gone before us. It is a work of mercy to pray for our dead. The November lists are available for you to take and complete for those you want to remember. There are still blank forms available, as well as being able to download from the Cathedral website. Return the list to the Cathedral by placing it in an envelope with a donation for the Holy Souls if you wish. This year, the Book of Remembrance will not be available to touch or go through, as normal. I have also created a *Virtual Book of Remembrance* by scanning in the returned forms. The forms which have been returned have been scanned and uploaded, and are available on the website. During the month of November, the *de profundis* will be prayed for the faithful departed, whose names are placed in the Book of Remembrance.

Mass for Deceased Clergy – It is traditional during the month of November to pray for the repose of the souls of the clergy who have gone before us, marked with the sign of faith, particularly remembering those who have died in the past year. Archbishop George will celebrate the Mass for Deceased Clergy via live-streaming only on **Thursday, 26th November**, at the **6:00pm Mass**. Solemn Vespers for the dead will be prayed at 5:00pm.

Advent at the Cathedral

Advent marks the beginning of the new liturgical year. As well as marking new beginnings, Advent is a time of expectation and preparation, where we await the second coming of the Lord, as well as His immediate coming at Christmas. At the Cathedral there are a number of ways in which we are able to prepare for the solemnity of Christmas.

Sacrament of Reconciliation

During Advent, there will be the opportunity to experience the mercy of the Lord in the Sacrament of Reconciliation throughout the week.

Saturday, 19th December 2020 - Sacrament of Reconciliation will be available throughout the day. Confessions begin after the morning Mass, as usual, and will run continuous until 5:00pm. More information to follow.

Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception (Tuesday, 8th December) is the diocesan solemnity, where we seek our Blessed Lady's intercession and protection. The solemnity will begin with Solemn Evening Prayer and Benediction at 5:00pm on Monday evening (7th December). **Holy Mass** open to the public will be celebrated at **10:00am**. There will also be a Chapter Mass at 12:30pm which includes the installation of Canon-elect David Hayman to the Metropolitan Chapter. Due to social distancing rules, and limited numbers in the Cathedral, this Mass will be by ticket only.

Ordination to the Diaconate - On Sunday, 13th December, Christian Mahoney will be ordained to the diaconate. Due to the social-distancing rules, and limited seating spaces available, this Mass will be by invitation only. Please keep Christian and his family in your prayers.

The annual **Service of Lessons and Carols** will take place on **Sunday, 20th December 2020**, beginning at **3:00pm**. The Service of Lessons and Carols will be followed by mulled wine (or tea or coffee) and mince pies at the Cornerstone, served to socially distant tables. The bar will also be open. The price of the ticket is £10.00. Max of four per table. Due to limited numbers at both the Cathedral and the Cornerstone, this will be a ticket-only event.
