A Message from Archbishop George...

Dear Parishioners,

As you come into St. David's Cathedral today you will see some changes which have been long planned but only now undertaken. They are designed to enhance the liturgical life of the Cathedral as well as addressing much needed health and Safety issues.

1. The most obvious improvement is the installation of a permanent altar and ambo together with a stone plinth for the tabernacle, all made of matching Portland stone. These items were originally in the church of St. Clare, Ely. The former St. Clare's church which will shortly be re-opened by the Society of St. Vincent de Paul as an outreach and support centre for those in need. The SVP is currently advertising a full time salaried post as manager. Details are available on the Diocesan website.

2. The heavy wooden doors in the narthex will shortly be replaced by glass doors in order to providing a more welcoming invitation to those who come to the Cathedral, and to enable those who pass by to see the interior and something of our worship.

3. The Baptismal Font will shortly be moved to a more prominent position beneath the balcony signifying it's theological significance as the point of entry into the new life of Christ which is given to all who are baptised.

4. The magnificent bronze statue of St. John the Baptist will be moved to a more prominent place in the baptistery and will benefit from new lighting.

5. The Archbishop's chair, the cathedra, will be renovated and the carved wooden mitre

which is part of the original decoration will be replaced.

6. The steps at the main entrance will be removed and replaced with paving which will conform to the new health and Safety regulations.

7. The large brick wall at the back of the Cathedral site (facing the former Debenhams) will be demolished and replaced with railings and a gate which will provide easier access to Charles Street from that part of the shopping area.

8. At roof level, debris and floral and fauna debris will be removed from the guttering and some repairs will take place since water ingress has caused damage at this difficult height.

9. Pigeons and other avian creatures have made their home in the ceiling over the sanctuary and have done a great deal of damage to the fabric. Cleaning and securing this site will be a challenging though necessary work.

10. All of these works have been a long time in planning and have become increasingly urgent. Needless to say, they are very expensive but essential for the future maintenance of the Cathedral. Grateful thanks to those who have made donations to enable the works to proceed. Should you wish to make a donation to support the ongoing improvements, it would be gratefully received. Please pray that no more problems are identified as we progress!
