### **Day of Prayer for Victims and Survivors of Abuse – Tuesday, 4<sup>th</sup> May 2021**

The Pontifical Commission for the Protection of Minors (PCPM) has highlighted the importance of prayer and suggested to Pope Francis that the worldwide Catholic Church should join together in a day of prayer for victims and survivors of Abuse. The Holy Father has welcomed this initiative.

From 2021, in response to a request from the Let’s Be Honest working group, the Bishops chose the Tuesday of the Fifth Week of Easter as the Day of Prayer for Victims and Survivors of Abuse — 4 May 2021. There were two connected reasons for moving the Day of Prayer from Lent to Easter: this is not

a penitential day for the failure of the Church and others to respond to the scourge of abuse but a day of prayer for those who have been abused in a season of hope and new life.

The Cathedral schedule for the Day of Prayer will be:

7:30am	Holy Mass
8:00am	Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, followed by Morning Prayer
8:30am	Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament (online only until 10:30am)
10:30am	Adoration (open to the public)
11:30am	The Holy Rosary, followed by Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament
12:45pm	Holy Mass, followed by Exposition until 3:00pm
