A reflection of Pope Benedict XVI on the Sacred Heart of Jesus

The deepest meaning of this devotion to God's love is revealed solely through a more attentive consideration of its contribution not only to the knowledge, but also and especially to the personal experience of this love in trusting dedication to its service.

When we practise this devotion, not only do we recognize God's love with gratitude but we continue to open ourselves to this love so that our lives are ever more closely patterned upon it. God, who poured out his love "*into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us*" (cf. Rom 5: 5), invites us tirelessly to accept his love. The main aim of the invitation to give ourselves entirely to the saving love of Christ and to consecrate ourselves to it is, consequently, to bring about our relationship with God.

This explains why the devotion, which is totally oriented to the love of God who sacrificed himself for us, has an irreplaceable importance for our faith and for our life in love. Whoever inwardly accepts God is moulded by him. The experience of God's love should be lived by men and women as a "calling" to which they must respond...

Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament – There are several opportunities to adore the Lord in the Most Blessed Sacrament throughout the week. These opportunities are available in person, to visit the Cathedral, as well as being on the livestream:

Solemn Evening Prayer and Benediction – returns on Sunday (Corpus Christi), beginning at 4:30pm. While the congregation will be unable to sing, this will be open to the public. During Sung Vespers we continue to pray for the intentions of the Archbishop and the whole diocesan family. On the solemnity of Corpus Christi, I will process to the doors of the Cathedral with the Blessed Sacrament and give Benediction over the city of Cardiff.

June: Month Dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus

June is traditionally dedicated to the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus. At the heart of the month of the Sacred Heart is the feast day, this year being celebrated on Friday, 11th June 2021. The Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus is designated as *The Day of Prayer for the Sanctification of Priests*.

During the month dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, we will pray the Litany of the Sacred Heart of Jesus at the beginning of Adoration each day, at the conclusion of the 12:45pm Mass. Each week we will pray for the priests of a particular deanery, mentioning the priests by name. This will go as follows:
